On Saturday 14th September, we will be holding training on "Fire and Evacuation for key persons" to cover our responsibility to have "fire warden" training. The training is aimed at people who may need to take the lead in a fire or evacuation or who are in a position of responsibility at the theatre such as: Committee Trustees, Directors, Producers, Backstage (for working evenings), FoH managers, technical staff (for setup/working days), Backstage managers, Youth leaders.

We will keep the training as quick as possible, and we reserve the right to provide you with nice biscuits...(!)

We are also planning to have an optional training/briefing/workshop for Front of House Managers following the fire training. Bar volunteers/FoH staff and anyone considering volunteering for FoH manager role would be very welcome.

Forthcoming ... a funny and captivating play Lilies on the Land

5th - 8th March 2025



A revealing, funny and wonderfully moving portrait of four women who sign up to join the Women's Land Army during World War II.

Based on one hundred and fifty letters and interviews with original Land Girls, along with songs from the period, Lilies on the Land charts the personal journeys of four women who join the Women's Land Army – determined to work endless backbreaking hours on farms across the country in a bid to do their best for the War Effort.

But how do these women, all hailing from different walks of life, torn from their families and bereft of all basic home comforts, deal with the hardships of farming life and the pressures of war? Maybe work clothes full of mice and toilet rolls falling from the sky are just what it takes for these girls to get through...

A Note from Linda Bostock (Director)

Hi everyone,

I'm super excited to tell you that I will be directing Lilies on the land. This will be our March 2025 production at Shinfield players theatre, performance dates are 5-8 of March 2025. With rehearsals starting mid November on Tuesdays a Thursdays.

The reminiscence begins in 1967 with the death of Winston Churchill, so 20 odd years after the end of the war. I have to just say that I have been interested in the life of the land girls during WW2 since we lived in Eastbourne about 20 years ago.

One day whilst walking through a cemetery at Pevensey, we came across a war grave for a young girl called Peggy Harland. On further investigations by my husband, Mike, we found she had been a 17-yearold land girl who had come into Eastbourne with her friend for a shopping trip, on her day off. As Eastbourne is the last town before the German planes reached the channel, any leftover bombs were often dropped there. Due to a load of bureaucracy about sounding air raid sirens, very sadly, Peggy was caught up in one of these air raids. We often went and visited her grave and Mike wrote a song about her. So, I like to think this will be a tribute to Peggy as well as all the land girls. (and I do love a dungaree) Linda

A witty and moving, musical coming in 2025

Just So

18th, 19th, 24th, 25th and 26th April



JUST SO is an award-winning musical inspired by Rudyard Kipling's Just So Stories and originally produced by Cameron Mackintosh, featuring an upbeat musical score by George Stiles and book and lyrics by Anthony Drewe.

It's a fun, comedic and imaginative musical which celebrates individuality and has friendship at its heart. There are a number of flexible lead roles and lots of opportunities for ensemble. Kipling's original work is a collection of fables focusing on how certain animals got their signature traits including "How the Leopard Got His Spots" and "How the Elephant Got His Trunk."

In Stiles' and Drewe's empowering musical adaptation, the short stories come together to form one full-length piece incorporating many elements of Kipling's original along the way. "Before the High and Far-off Times... came the Time of the Very Beginnings," The Eldest Magician begins to share a tale about the animals they created and how they all looked the same.

All of the animals got along, except for the giant crab, Pau Amma, whose lifestyle wreaked havoc on the other creatures. Aided in part by the Eldest Magician and the Kolokolo Bird, The Elephant's Child goes on a daring journey to stop Pau Amma from flooding the other creatures out. On the way, the Child learns about courage, individuality, and friendship – and the audience learn how every creature came to be "just so."
