Read through and auditions for this captivating play Lilies on the Land

Hi everyone,

I want to let you all know the plans so far for Lilies of the Land, which is our production for next March.

Read through date is Saturday October 26th at 5pm at Shinfield Theatre.

Audition date is Saturday 2nd November, 10 am, Shinfield Theatre.

There is also a reserve audition date of **Saturday 16th November** in case I can't cast it on 2nd November.

The play was devised by the Lions part group from interviews with ex land girls, in 2010. So, all the events portrayed are true and have been dramatised for the stage. There is a fair amount of singing of war time era songs.

I have had a lot of interest from a wide age range of people so my thoughts on casting have become more flexible.

I'm looking for 4 or 8 women 18-55 to play either

4 land girls who play their older and younger selves

or

4 older land girls in 1967 reminiscing after the death of Winston Churchill and 4 younger land girls who will play their younger selves (memories).

They will all also double up as all other characters in the play, such as farmers, soldiers, boyfriends, friends, etc.

If I cast 4 older women, they will go backwards in time to portray their young selves during the Second World War, as land girls. If I cast 4 younger women , vice versa. From the interest people have shown, my preference would be to cast 8, that is 4 older

women who are reminiscing, and 4 younger women as their wartime selves.

All ages will play many other characters and partake in whatever activities the land girls are doing. E.g. one of the girls lives with a farmer and his wife who were "not very kind" to her.

Margie...from a large family in Newcastle. She describes herself as having a liking for makeup and rollers. County Durham or Newcastle accent needed which we can work on, but not essential for the audition.

Peggy...a happy, confident, cockney from a large family in the east end. She knows nothing about farming but soon acquires ploughing skills second to none.

Poppy...from a happy privileged family, who expected her to join the WRNS, but the romantic posters entice her into signing up for the land army, which she throws herself into with energy and enthusiasm.

Vera...a complex character escaping her snobby stepmother. Competent and hearty, she is the loneliest one of the four land girls and probably the only one to have read Virginia Woolf.

There are 28 other characters also portrayed by the cast.

Performance dates are 5-8th March 2025.

As usual, tech and dress rehearsal will be the weekend and week before hand. Rehearsals will be on Tuesday and Thursdays at 7.30, as soon as Safari party has finished (end of November) and will involve workshopping on war time culture and characters. Due to a personal interest in land girls I would like this to be a tribute to the largely unrecognised back-breaking work these girls did and am so looking forward to telling their amazing stories.

If you want to read a script, give me a shout or if you can't make any of the audition dates let me know and we'll work it out. (I'm away 3-12th November)

JUST SO is an award-winning musical inspired by Rudyard Kipling's Just So Stories and originally produced by Cameron Mackintosh, featuring an upbeat musical score by George Stiles and book and lyrics by Anthony Drewe.

It's a fun, comedic and imaginative musical which celebrates individuality and has friendship at its heart. There are several flexible lead roles and lots of opportunities for ensemble.

Kipling's original work is a collection of fables focusing on how animals got their signature traits including "How the Leopard Got His Spots" and "How the Elephant Got His Trunk."

In Stiles' and Drewe's empowering musical adaptation, the short stories come together to form one full-length piece incorporating many elements of Kipling's original along the way. "Before the High and Far-off Times... came the Time of the Very Beginnings," The Eldest Magician begins to share a tale about the animals they created and how they all looked the same.

All of the animals got along, except for the giant crab, Pau Amma, whose lifestyle wreaked havoc on the other creatures. Aided in part by the Eldest Magician and the Kolokolo Bird, The Elephant's Child goes on a daring journey to stop Pau Amma from flooding the other creatures out. On the way, the Child learns about courage, individuality, and friendship – and the audience learn how every creature came to be "just so."
