From the Chair

As we look forward to 2025, it is good to reflect on the successful year that we had at SPT in 2024. In total, we put on 8 productions and welcomed many new members and welcomed back many returning members. Our annual January pantomime was Rapunzel which brought much fun and games to the stage. We staged three plays, Nightwatch a gripping thriller in March, The farce Chase Me Up Farndale Avenue (s'il vous plait) in June and The Safari Party a dark comedy in November. Our two musicals were the iconic tap-dancing musical Anything Goes in April, and our sell-out production of Sister Act in October. We also had two very successful youth group productions; Zoom from the Junior and Middles youth group in June and Footloose from the Senior youth group in July. As well as these productions, there have been many successful Theatreoke social evenings, our Shinnies and Celebration Evening and the youth group reviews.

Thank you to everyone who has performed in shows, built sets, helped front of house and backstage and generally kept the theatre going. Thank you also to everyone who has come and watched our shows. So, looking forward to 2025, we already have two productions in rehearsal: our pantomime Sleeping Beauty and the March play Lilies on the Land. Previews and auditions for our spring musical Just So are set to start in January and we have a full season to come through the year. We look forward to welcoming audiences to all of our shows thorough the year and to enjoying watching live theatre together.

Outside of the productions, there will be some necessary building work to the toilet block which will start in the next few months. It is inevitable that there will be some disturbance at the theatre due to the building work. We hope to keep disruption to a minimum.

The committee will be writing to members with more information on the work as soon as possible in the New Year.


